



### The Art of Facings 1/2-Day Workshop Afternoon of Saturday, February 17, 2018

**INSTRUCTOR:** Patricia Belyea **QUILTERS GUILD:** Columbia River Gorge

In this 1/2-Day Workshop, we will make four placemats finished with four different facing styles:

- End Cap Facing
- Pinwheel Facing
- Designer-pieced Facing
- Bordered Facing.

The placemats will serve as learning tools to represent small quilts, and will also be useful as placemats!

#### **Sewing Tools and Supplies Needed**

Sewing machine and gear—such as thread, scissors, pins, ripper etc.

Basting pins & a tool like Kwik Klip to close pins

Masking tape

Walking foot for your machine, if you have one

Blue water-soluble marking pen; Clover makes a good one

Cutting tools—24" or larger cutting mat, 24" grid ruler, rotary cutter  
*(If you don't have a 24" grid ruler, make sure your neighbor does)*

#### **Fabrics and Batting Needed**

##### **Front of Placemats**

4 X 14" x 20" pieces of patterned cotton that you like

##### **Back of Placemats**

4 X 14" x 20" pieces of patterned cotton that you like and coordinates with front fabric

##### **Batting**

4X 14" x 20" pieces of low-loft batting such as cotton, bamboo or silk

##### **Facings**

Solid-colored or small-print cottons (fillers) that coordinate with your two patterned cottons. I suggest that at least one of your 1/2 yard fabrics be a solid:

Fabric A—1/2 yard

Fabric B—1/2 yard

Fabric C—1/4 yard

Feel free to bring a couple more pieces of facing fabrics if you want to have more variety in your Designer-pieced Facing.

*Note: Hopefully this Supply List will not require a trip to the store. See if you can bring fabrics from your stash!*
