Basic Disappearing Nine Patch




- *Assemble 9 fabric blocks in a pattern pleasing to you (don't forget to use some contrast). Keep in mind that the square in the center will be cut into 4 small pieces and the corner squares will not be cut at all.
- * Using 1/4" seam, stitch blocks together.
- * Then press seams on outside rows <u>away</u> from center block. Press seams on inside rows <u>toward</u> center block. Matching seams, stitch outside rows to center row (your seams should "nest"). Press seams toward outside of block. Your 9 patch is complete Now to make it disappear.
- * Cut 9 patch apart horizontally, then vertically exactly through the middle each direction. (as in above photo)..



* Rearrange the 4 sections to create a new block. Experiment until you have the block that you want.

Disappearing Four Patch



- A. Lay out 4 squares. Consider using contrasting colors. Stitch to create a 4 patch block.
- B. Make four cuts into the four patch, each 1.5 away from the center seam. I use a 3" ruler, You'll have nine pieces.
- C. Rearrange the 9 pieces until you have a block pleasing to you.
- D. Stitch the 9 pieces together three pieces to rows. On the middle row, press the seams out.. On the outer rows, press the seams in so they will "nest" together.
