Supply List Fabrics

Before class, check out the chickens on my website, www.annshawquilting.com or Ruth McDowell's website, www.ruthbmcdowell.com). Note the broad variety of fabrics used in each class sample -- large prints, medium prints, small prints, batiks, plaids, stripes, mottled fabrics, prints with multiple colors, bold fabrics as well as pastels. Having a variety of fabric choices is key to this style of quilt. Fat quarters are probably as much as you'll need of any one fabric; background pieces sometimes require one half yard or less. Bring your bag of scraps!! In each case, we'll use the fabric patterns to create texture and depth in your quilt. Lots of different prints work well as chicken feathers. Your local quilt shop will have a variety of patterned fabrics that will work well for these chickens!

You will also need the following supplies:

For Freezer Paper Template:

Freezer paper
Sharpie brand Ultra Fine-line permanent marker (Black only)
Colored pencils (variety of colors for making tick marks)
Highlighters (several colors)
Pencils/Eraser/ Pencil Sharpener
Ruler (18" plastic ruler is ideal)
Paper scissors
Blue Masking Tape



Design Wall: If you have a foam design board (20"x30" or larger) bring it to class. A similarly sized piece of flannel, batting, or a flannel-backed tablecloth will also work well. (Makes it easy to carry home your project!!)

Sewing Supplies:

Pins (Lots and lots of pins! 1" or longer are ideal)
Fabric scissors
Basic sewing kit
Rotary cutter, 14" or 18" rotary cutting ruler and cutting mat
Several Ziploc bags (quart and gallon size)

Sewing machine and supplies (bobbins thread, needles etc). You should be comfortable using your machine. Check to be sure that it is in good working order. There will likely be some time to begin sewing your design together.
